**Minutes of the Regular Scheduled Meeting
May 13, 2021**

I. Call to Order:

Chairman Whitfield called to order the Regular Scheduled Commissioner's Meeting held at Annex III, 201 S. Main Street, LaFayette, Georgia at 7:00 PM on May 13, 2021.

II. Attendees:

The following were present: Chairman Shannon Whitfield, Commissioner Robert Blakemore, Commissioner Mark Askew, Commissioner Brian Hart, Commissioner Robert Stultz, Public Relations Director Joe Legge, Economic Development Director Robert Wardlaw, Legal and Policy Director David Gottlieb, Walker County Police Chief Mitchell Moore, Planning and Zoning Director David Brown, Public Works Director Carlen Bowers, Deputy Chief Nathan Farrow, Board Clerk Whitney Summey and County Clerk Rebecca Wooden. Other guests signed in at the meeting as well. Please see the attached sign in sheet.

III. Approval of Agenda:

Chairman Whitfield asked if there was a motion by the board to approve the agenda. Commissioner Blakemore made a motion to approve the agenda and the motion was seconded by Commissioner Stultz, 4 ayes and 0 nays, motion was approved.

IV. Public Hearing:

Chairman Whitfield invited Alex Smith with the Northwest Georgia Regional Commission to discuss the Joint Comprehensive Plan with Walker County and the cities of Chickamauga, LaFayette, Lookout Mountain, and Rossville. He explained the purpose of the Joint Comprehensive Plan is to maintain Qualified Local Government status and this is the five year update. He gave details of the six elements required. This project is open to the public's input and there will be a Stakeholder Committee appointed to represent the community. The draft will be ready by December and there will be another public hearing to discuss it. The final plan will be submitted on February 28, 2022.

The public hearing was then closed.

V. Approval of Minutes:

Chairman Whitfield stated the minutes from the last Commissioner's Meeting were in the packet and before the board. Commissioner Stultz made a motion to approve the minutes and the motion was seconded by Commissioner Blakemore, 4 ayes and 0 nays, motion was approved.

VI. Public Comment:

Chairman Whitfield asked if there was anyone that would like to speak in the Public Comment section. Gary Williams came forward and asked about the criteria to be on the Comprehensive Plan Stakeholder Committee and if each district was represented or if each District Commissioner had made a recommendation. Chairman Whitfield explained all citizens can participate and the committee is just representatives from the community. Chairman Whitfield stated the Stakeholder Committee had many staff members on it because of the amount of work that will be done to get all the information together. Mr. Williams asked if each of the cities will also have representatives. Chairman Whitfield said there will also be representatives from each of the cities and the Board of Commissioners will vote on the final plan before it is submitted.

VII. Informational:

Chairman Whitfield asked Wade Hutcheson, County Extension Agent/Coordinator, with UGA Extension Walker County to come forward and explain what they do within the county. Mr. Hutcheson stated they are a statewide public service outreach agency that works to translate science, research, and education between Government, UDSA, UGA, youth, and families. He explained their programs in Agriculture and Natural Resources, 4-H Youth Development, and Family and Consumer Sciences. Casey Hobbs, 4H Agent, explained how the 4H program is working with the youth in the county. Mr. Hutcheson stated their programs and classes are spread throughout the county to reach the maximum number of citizens and the AG Center is a great place for many of their activities. Chairman Whitfield thanked them and said all of the programs they offer were great for the citizens.

VIII. New Business:

- I. Chairman Whitfield read Resolution R-017-21, and explained that John Conely would be written in to be added to the list of appointed members. Chairman Whitfield made a motion to approve, Commissioner Hart seconded the motion, 4 ayes and 0 nays, motion carried.
- II. Chairman Whitfield read Resolution R-018-21, and asked if there was any discussion. Commissioner Askew made a motion to approve, Commissioner Blakemore seconded the motion, 4 ayes and 0 nays, motion carried.

- III. Chairman Whitfield read the Intergovernmental Agreement between Walker County, GA and Chattooga County, GA. He explained the vehicle had mechanical issues that were beyond repair and Chattooga County had the same make and model vehicle that had body damage. Chattooga County's damaged vehicle was their K9 unit and they did not have the funds to repair it. Chattooga County could use Walker County's vehicle to fix the body damage and get their K9 unit back to work. Walker County will deliver the vehicle to Chattooga County in as is condition and will have no liability to the vehicle. Commissioner Blakemore made a motion to approve, Commissioner Stultz seconded the motion, 4 ayes and 0 nays, motion carried.
- IV. Chairman Whitfield discussed Purchase Order 2021-00001269 for 20 AED devices to Stryker Medical for Walker County Fire Rescue, totalling \$33,180.20. Deputy Chief Farrow explained the new AED devices would have an eight year warranty and a four year battery warranty. He stated the current inventory is around sixteen years old. They currently have seventeen on hand with two in fixed locations. These AED devices are used frequently and this purchase would expand their inventory and allow them to have them in more locations . Commissioner Stultz asked where the fixed locations were and if they were in the county buildings. Chairman Whitfield explained there are 16-18 additional AED devices in different county buildings and they had all been purchased within the last year through the safety committee. Commissioner Stultz made a motion to approve, Commissioner Hart seconded the motion, 4 ayes and 0 nays, motion carried.
- V. Chairman Whitfield explained there was a pending purchase order for new fire hydrants, but they did not receive all of the information back in time for the meeting. He stated the companies placing bids for the fire hydrants all stated they are expecting a significant increase in price in July, so he would like to see if the board would like to table the matter until the next meeting. Commissioner Hart made a motion to table, Commissioner Blakemore seconded the motion, 4 ayes and 0 nays, motion carried.
- VI. Chairman Whitfield reviewed the Departmental Statistics for April 2021.

IX. Commissioner Comments:

Commissioner Blakemore thanked everyone for their support and involvement. He stated Operation Rossville Playground had a great turnout at the cake auction last week and it had brought the total up to a little over \$10,000.00 for the playground. He stated there will be an All-star softball tournament coming up to help with fundraising for Operation Rossville Playground. Commissioner Askew said he has

been looking into dates to have a community meeting, but he wanted to reach out to citizens, groups, and organizations in the county and see if there are any that would like for him to come to them to speak and listen to their concerns. Commissioner Hart said he would like to invite everyone to come out to the square on Saturday for the Hometown Music Event. He stated LaFayette High School is having their graduation soon and their graduation rate is 90.53%. He also gave information on the upcoming Armed Forces Day Luncheon. Commissioner Stultz gave information on the upcoming Rabies Clinic. Commissioner Stultz explained this is National Police Officer Week and he wanted to thank all of our local agencies, Sheriff's office, and State Patrol. He also gave information on the Farmers Market and encouraged everyone to go out and support them. Chairman Whitfield explained the importance of animal rabies shots and reiterated the rabies clinic information. He stated the first positive case since 2014 had been confirmed last week in a wild animal. He stated the rabies clinic is very affordable, quick, and has convenient locations throughout the county.

X. Executive Session:

Commissioner Askew made a motion to go into Executive Session to discuss personnel matters, Commissioner Stultz seconded the motion, with 4 ayes and 0 nays the motion carried. Executive session began at 7:54PM.

Chairman Whitfield called the meeting back to order from the Executive Session at 9:40PM, explaining no action was taken from the Executive Session.

Adjournment:

Commissioner Blakemore made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Commissioner Hart seconded the motion, motion carried and the meeting was adjourned at 9:41PM.

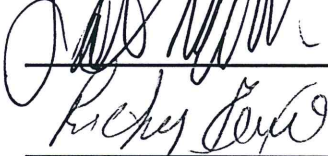

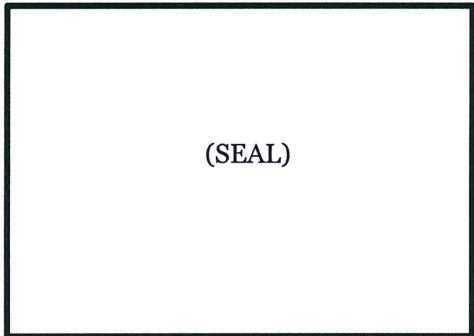

WHEREAS, the County budgeted for new fire hydrants in the 2020 SPLOST and was awarded a community grant from the Ironman Foundation to purchase additional hydrants;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Walker County, Georgia that the Chairperson is authorized to spend up to \$250,000 this fiscal year on the purchase of new fire hydrants for the county.
